DIVISION 2 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

Delivering essential infrastructure for some of the city's fastest growing suburbs is a focus for Division 2 in Ipswich City Council's 2024–2025 Budget.

Deputy Mayor and Division 2 Councillor Nicole Jonic said council is making responsible decisions and investing in services which meet the growing community needs for Division 2.

"It is great to see some important projects progressing in the next year for our fast-growing suburbs," Deputy Mayor Jonic said.

"I am particularly excited about the Stage 3 work on Redbank Plains Road, a \$1.8 million investment to continue work extending the four-lane road, extended from Keidges Road to Kruger Parade.

"Council is continuing its biggest road upgrade project with \$28 million for the Springfield Parkway and Springfield Greenbank Arterial road duplication projects.

Division 2 Councillor Paul Tully said the community would also see vital work at local swimming pools and water play areas.

"Council will also allocate funding to develop sediment management for Robelle Domain Lagoon, after major impacts after the January storms," Cr Tully said.

"Our sports facilities will also be upgraded, including the \$1.35 million replacement of existing lighting towers and luminaires at Bob Gibbs Park sports fields at Springfield.

"We will install new \$625,000 park infrastructure, including rebound wall and nature play areas, at Opossum Creek Parklands in Brookwater, with significant investment from the State Government."
