DIVISION 4 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

Delivering suburban projects for residents across Ipswich's western suburbs and towns is a core focus of the Ipswich City Council 2024-2025 Budget.

Division 4 Councillor David Cullen said the Budget would deliver upgrades on community assets such as the Rosewood Library, improvements to council's road network in Thagoona and beyond, and sports field upgrades.

"Across our growing western suburbs, council is delivering major sports field upgrades including a \$1 million lighting upgrade for Ivor Marsden Memorial Sports Centre, and \$500,000 to plan upgrades for the Tivoli Sporting Complex.

"These are important projects for our sports-loving community and I'm pleased to see funding allocated in council's budget.

"This year council will also deliver stage 2 of a major expansion to Tallegalla Cemetery, costing \$3.2 million."

Division 4 Councillor Jim Madden said the budget further included funding for critical road and drainage upgrades.

"Residents on Adelong Avenue in Thagoona will welcome an allocation of \$1.5 million this year to deliver road pavement reconstruction works," Cr Madden said.

"Council will also invest in environmental projects including ephemeral wetlands at Sutton Park in Brassall, an important urban greening initiative that helps reduce pollutants in our natural waterways.

"In the years ahead, we will also welcome \$40 million of State, Federal and council funding for the upgrade of North Ipswich Reserve, a major project for our sports-mad city.

"Across our western towns and suburbs, this Budget is delivering for Division 4."
