# Littering and Illegal Dumping

Littering and illegal dumping is an offence under the Waste Reduction and Recycling Act 2011. The unlawful disposal of any unwanted material in locations other than accepted waste facilities is an illegal activity. There are penalties associated with the offences



# What is illegal dumping?

Illegal dumping is the unlawful deposit of waste material over 200L in volume. This is approximately the volume of a standard residential wheelie bin.

## What is littering?

Littering is the unlawful deposit of waste material less than 200L in volume.

# Littering and illegal dumping officers

Council has a dedicated enforcement team investigating littering and illegal dumping incidents. In the first instance, council gives the offender an opportunity to clean the waste up, however council has a separate clean-up crew available should this not occur to protect and preserve the environment. If the unlawful activity is on private property, it is the landowner's responsibility to remove materials.

## Fines for illegal dumping

- Fines for an individual for illegal dumping are more than \$2,400 and may be more than \$154,800 in court
- Fines for a corporation are more than \$7,700 and may be more than \$774,000 in court.

# Ways to lawfully dispose waste

There are services and facilities to help you dispose of your waste:

- Check if it can go into your general waste red lid bin or co-mingle recycling bin
- Take excess waste to your local recycling and refuse centre. Check council's website for accepted materials, hours of operation, charges and hints and tips. Locations include:

**Riverview Recycling and Refuse Centre** 81 Riverview Road, Riverview

#### **Rosewood Recycling and Refuse Centre** 94 Oakleigh Colliery Road, Rosewood

- If the item still has use or value, consider donating it to a charity
- Similarly, you can advertise the materials or items to give-away, just remember to keep them inside your property until they are collected
- Take tyres to an accepted recycling facility. Charges for disposal will apply
